She extended an invitation to visit the community that includes 42 homes, guest lodge, community center and Tribute Park. This fund has been used in the past for the service and a headstone of a 3 year old that tragically perished in a fire. Great work done by the Lansing Puddle in supporting all of these worthwhile causes!






