successful Grand Nest Convention.






Detroit Puddle Supports Goodfellows Shoe Program

While the Goodfellows primary mission as indicated on their website "is the purchase of merchandise and the distribution of holiday gift packages, several other programs have been developed to serve the children of our community. These programs enhance the quality of life of our area's young people in a variety of significant ways."

"The Shoe Program is just one of many such programs. This exemplary program provides shoes for children who cannot afford proper footwear. These children are identified through the Attendance and Administrative Offices in the school districts with which we work. They are then presented with vouchers for a complimentary pair of shoes at any Detroit area Mr. Alan's store. Mr. Alan's fits the child with the right pair of shoes and then turns the costs over to the Goodfellows."

As a result of our commitment to support the Goodfellows annually, Frank Brady advises that the annual proceeds from the Detroit Puddle donations will be henceforth earmarked for their Shoe Program assuring the Goodfellows with an annual infusion of dollars and making sure that as many qualified children as possible are fitted with a new pair of shoes.




